
Should anyone have any problems recording scores with the NCGA, or if you are not receiving emails with tournament information, please let me know.

Rules Corner



The following question was sent to us.

In Davis in a tournament a fellow player did not drop from the drop area and instead dropped no closer to the hole but where his ball went into the water...later after the round was finished he was

Disqualified as the official stated you must drop from a drop area when it is posted as a drop area......Yesterday i watched as players on # 2 hit their ball in the water then proceeded to cross the lake and hit from the other side....can you check with our "rules" official and let me know which is the correct play as per usga rules ??????

Unless use of the Drop Zone was mandatory, the decison is questionable

The following is from the USGA Rules concerning Drop Zones.

If the *Committee* considers that it is not feasible or practicable to proceed in accordance with a Rule providing relief, it may establish dropping zones in which balls may or must be dropped when taking relief. Generally, such dropping zones should be provided as an additional relief option to those available under the Rule itself, rather than being mandatory.

Using the example of a dropping zone for a *water hazard*, when such a dropping zone is established, the following Local Rule is recommended:

"If a ball is in or it is known or virtually certain that a ball that has not been found is in the water hazard (specify location), the player may:

- (i) proceed under Rule 26; or
- (ii) as an additional option, drop a ball, under penalty of one stroke, in the dropping zone.

PENALTY FOR BREACH OF LOCAL RULE:

<u>Match play</u> – Loss of hole; <u>Stroke play</u> – Two strokes."

Note: When using a dropping zone the following provisions apply regarding the dropping and re-dropping of the ball:

- (a) The player does not have to stand within the dropping zone when dropping the ball.
- (b) The dropped ball must first strike a part of the course within the dropping zone.
- (c) If the dropping zone is defined by a line, the line is within the dropping zone.
- (d) The dropped ball does not have to come to rest within the dropping zone.
- (e) The dropped ball must be re-dropped if it rolls and comes to rest in a position covered by Rule 20-2c(i-vi).
- (f) The dropped ball may roll nearer the *hole* than the spot where it first struck a part of the *course*, provided it comes to

rest within two clublengths of that spot and not into any of the positions covered by (e).

- (g) Subject to the provisions of (e) and (f), the dropped ball may roll and come to rest nearer the hole than:
 - its original position or estimated position (see Rule 20-2b);
 - the *nearest point of relief* or maximum available relief (Rule 24-2, 25-1 or 25-3); or
 - the point where the original ball last crossed the margin of the *water* hazard or lateral water hazard (Rule 26-1).

Our local rule is as follows

There are two (2) optional Drop Zones. One (1) optional drop zone is located on Hole #2, Hills Course, and one (1) optional Drop Zone is located on Hole #3, Orchard Course. If a ball is in or it is known or virtually certain that a ball that has not been found is in the ESA or the water hazard on either of these two (2) holes, the player may either 1) proceed under Rule 26-1 (Relief for Ball in Water Hazard) or 2) as an additional option, drop a ball, under penalty of one stoke, in the Drop Zone. For NCGA **Qualifiers and NCGA Team Match** Play, these Drop Zones shall not be used as a relief option under Rule 26-1 (this provision shall not apply to "Just-For-Fun" events conducted concurrently with either of these two (2) events.

Golf Course Update

As we continue to stay busy during the winter months, a few projects are about to wrap up. The edging of the bunkers on the Orchard course will be completed by February 1st and the cutting back of the deer grass on the Hills course will be finished up next week. Once these projects are complete, we will shift our focus to the continued removal of the built up sand around the collars. You will also see the aerification of fairways and tees starting within the next couple of weeks. Fairway fertilizing will begin next week and it will be in a liquid form. Why liquid? Well, this time of year when the soil temps are in the 40's there is very little microbial activity in the soil. Microbes break down the fertilizer so the plant can absorb it through the roots. When fertilizers are in a liquid form they are absorbed through the grass blade making it readily available for the plant. Calcium Nitrate and Iron will be applied so this should give us a little green up without pushing a lot of growth. Frosty mornings have plagued us for the past two weeks, frustrating for all of us. I assure you that we do everything possible to get you out on the course ASAP, while keeping the safety of the greens in mind. Try to stay warm out there!
