Superintendents Corner By Jason <u>Wolf</u>



Is summer over?

Seems as if we have fallen into our "fall" weather pattern. Mid 80s as a high, mid 50s as a low. It's nice to turn the AC off and let the cool breeze in. I think we will have one more stretch of 100+ degrees, let's hope I'm wrong!

As I drive around the courses looking at the areas of turf that are thin thinking, it's time to re-seed those areas AGAIN! Year after year we re-seed these areas with rye grass, get it to fill in and loose it in the heat of the summer. So I decided to make a change. We will be seeding these areas with Cynodon dactylon also known as Bermuda grass. This grass is very aggressive and has a deep root system. The grass creeps along the ground and roots wherever a node touches the ground, forming a dense mat. The seeding will begin next week. Once the seed is dropped into place, we will topdress the area to keep the seed covered and moist. The plan is to concentrate on fairways first than move into the rough if Mother Nature allows.

One of our most recent battles is the emergence of Spotted Spurge on some tees and fairways. This is a low growing weed that spreads and seeds rapidly. We have attempted to spray these areas twice with two different types of post emergent herbicide with little success. We went out this week and applied another post emergent. Third times a charm right? This product did work and you should see this eye sore disappear in a few weeks.

Along with the spurge we are also seeing a type of sedge and Kyllinga grass on some tees and fairways. The first application was applied two weeks ago and another app is due up in 5 days. Followed by a third if needed.

One last thing we completed in July was securing the bridge decking on #7 Orchard. We installed over 200 locking nuts and washers. This helped quiet down 5

the bridge down. Out next task will be the bridge from 14 to 15 Orchard. Enjoy August!

Rules Corner

Two situations have been brought to my attention. The first is a ball is struck and hits a bird or water fowl. Most likely in our situation it would be on of our visitors from the north, a goose. The player wants drop and hit another shot from the original spot without penalty. The correct ruling that the ball is in play wherever it lands. If in the course it counts as one shot. If it lands in a hazard or out of bounds it is played accordingly. Assume the original ball is hit from the tee of the second hole on the Hills course. The ball strikes on of our geese and lands in the water. The player can proceed to the drop area and play his third stroke. If playing in a NCGA qualifying tournament, the player can either drop a ball on the tee side of the water hazard or re-tee and he is hitting three.

The second situation occurred in a foursome in which I was playing. The player hit his tee shot from the tee on the eighth hole on the Hills course. The ball came to rest in the center of the grass divot; not the divot hole. The player requested a free drop which was denied. He was required to proceed to play the ball as it lay. He played the next shot as if the

ball was teed up and proceeded to hit the green and get his par.
