

Hard to believe that out of 280 members, only 81 participated in the Member/Member/ Guest "Memorial Tournament." That means only about 30% of our club benefited from all of the perks that came with participation. Let's do the math: There were four flights and each flight had a payout of \$170 to first through third place. Each flight had a long drive and a low gross winner for another \$100 in payouts. There were eight closest to the hole winners with a payout of \$120. In addition, there was a \$575 payout to the three horse race teams and another \$500 to five putting contest winners. By the way, for all of you higher index holders who don't play because you don't want to compete against the better golfers, WAKE UP. There were four flights, accommodating all levels of play. In the horse race, NONE of the single digit index players made it to the finals.

Let's keep doing the math. Some indicated the \$75 registration fee was too high and that was the reason they did not play. Math. I keep going back to math. EVERY participant had the opportunity to win a part of the \$1,200 in prize money. EVERYONE who was willing to invest \$10 had an opportunity to win a portion of the \$575 payout for the horse race. Those who were willing to invest \$5 had an opportunity to share in the \$500 pay out for the putting contest. In addition to all of these payouts, your \$75 entitled you to bring a guest and come to a post tournament dinner (Value: \$50 – at least); a "free lunch" - yes, there really is one –(Value: \$7); a fantastic breakfast buffet (Value: \$8); a tee-prize assortment that included a sleeve of balls (Value: \$6), Gatorade and two nutrition bars (Value: \$6), AND a free round of golf at Lincoln Hills (Value: \$44). Not factored into the over-all value is the time you would have had with a new or old friend (Value: Priceless). That means you would have received \$121 worth of amenities for \$75. Sounds like a good investment to me. By the way, speaking of time, some might avoid tournaments because of the time you THINK it takes to play. Tuesday our average playing time was 4 hours and 15 minutes.
