I have always believed that it is important to cultivate a relationship with Billy Casper Golf – which includes the Director of Golf, the Head Professional and Shop staff and the Superintendent. Thankfully, BCG feels the same way and gives evidence of that via the Course Care Committee. Thank you to those of you who emailed your concerns about various aspects of the course; each concern was voiced, heard and a commitment given to resolve the problem.

The following are some items that came out of the CCC which I believe you will find interesting:

1. <u>Capital Improvement</u> plans for 2016 include a new range ball machine that will be card controlled (meaning you will not have to go into the pro shop to purchase range balls); the two restrooms that boarder city streets will have keypad locks so that golfers can have access to the restrooms without general

public use tying them up; the tent will have new floor and side panel improvements when it re-opens in the spring (the tent will be taken down in the next few weeks); the range will be sporting new bag stands, dividers and club washers; and, finally, new carts will be coming in April.

- 2. Regarding the course, there will be concerted effort to <u>improve tee</u> <u>boxes</u> (with several total renovations), the filling of holes left by downed trees, trees will be trimmed up and the area around the tree mowed (this should greatly improve playability as well as speed of play).
- 3. Please be aware that <u>aerification</u> will take place on the Orchard Course on April 3 & 4 and on the Hills Course on March 27/28.

IN THE PRO SHOP

The Lincoln Hills Men's Golf Club and the NCGA will begin the 2016 "Early Registration" period on October 1st.

For Renewing Members, the dues from October 1, 2015 to December 31, 2015 will be \$83. Beginning January 1, 2016, the Renewing Members dues will increase to \$93.

For New Membership to our club, the fee will be \$93, but will entitle the New Member to play in the club events from October 1, 2015 through December 31, 2015. This is a great time to encourage your friends and neighbors to consider joining our club.

The fee for 2016 includes your hole-in-one insurance. Any member who has a hole- in-one in a club tournament/event will receive up to \$250 to pay their "Hole in One" bar bill.

By registering early, it will help the Board construct a realistic budget for 2016. Thank you for your Early Registration and for being an emissary for our club.

Rules

Casual Water

Find your nearest point of relief, no closer to the hole, where neither you nor your ball lie in water that can be seen without pressing your feet up and down. You may then drop your ball within 1 club length from that point no nearer to the hole with no penalty.

Grounding Your Club in a Hazard

Practice swings may be taken inside a hazard as long as you don't touch the ground, sand or water with your club.

The top of the grass may be touched during a practice swing. The penalty for grounding your club is loss of the hole in Match Play or a 2 shot penalty in Stroke Play.
