### WHAT IS WLGO?

All teams have the ability to One of-a-Kind Challenge Coins based on their final fundraising total.

## **Course Superintendent**

The heat is hard on everyone and everything, especially low mowed turf. We have a few things in our back pocket to help us get through the stressful times. One thing is the use of wetting agents on the turf. Wetting agents are substances that reduce the surface tension of water to allow it to spread drops onto a surface, increasing the spreading abilities of a liquid. Lowering the surface tension lowers the energy required to spread drops onto a film, thus weakening the cohesive properties of the liquid and strengthening its adhesive properties allowing the water to move down to the roots.
