I would like to encourage our members to think about how they can keep our playing time to  $4\frac{1}{2}$  hours. The following are some suggestions:

- 1. Play "ready golf." If other players are selecting clubs, determining distance, etc., but you are ready, hit away. (Obvious exception would be in match play.)
- 2. Consider putting out rather than marking when you are close to the hole and will not disturb someone's line.
- 3. If you need extra time to get to your cart, consider starting early (before the others have holed out).
- 4. Read your putt while the first person to putt is reading his; don't wait until it is your turn to prepare to putt.

5. While keeping a safe distance/location, move as close to your ball as possible in preparation to hit.

6. Drop your cart partner off to hit, then go to your ball to hit and come back to pick up your partner.

If you have other suggestions, let me know and we will add them next month.

I'm looking forward to a great year of competition. Again, to all our members, WELCOME! Hit 'em long and straight and, if long is not possible, go for straight.



# RULES CHAIRMAN ROGER VAL

Rules of Golf

As your new incoming Rules Chairman, I would like to first introduce myself. My wife (Mary) and I moved here three plus years ago after retiring from a 30 year career with the Northern California Golf Association (NCGA) as Director of Rules and Competitions. It is an honor and privilege to now serve on the LHMGC board and become an added resource.

The coming year 2016 i the year of rules changes. The Rules of Golf are updated every four years and the Decisions on the Rules of Golf are updated every two years. The United States Golf Association and the R&A Rules Limited validate all changes involving the rules and decisions.

Significant Changes for 2016

Rule 18-2b (Ball moving After Address)

Rule 18-2b Ball Moving after Address has been withdrawn. This rule stated that once the player addressed the ball and the ball moved the player is deemed to have moved it. Now that 18-2b is no longer even after address the player is no longer automatically deemed to have caused the ball to move. A one-stroke penalty under Rule 18-2 will be applied ONLY when the facts show that the player has caused the ball to move.

Rule 6-6d (Wrong Score for Hole)

A new exception has been introduced to Rule 6-6d to provide that a player is not disqualified for returning a lower score for a hole than actually taken as a result of failing to include a penalty stroke(s) that the player did not know was incurred before returning the score card. Instead the player incurs the penalty under the rule that was breached and must add an additional penalty of two strokes for the score card error. In all other cases in which a player returns a score for any hole lower than actually taken, the penalty will continue to be disqualification.

Rule 14-3 (Artificial devices, Unusual Equipment and Abnormal Use of Equipment)

The penalty for a player's first breach of rule 14-3 during the round has been reduced from disqualification to loss of hole in match play and two strokes in stroke play. The penalty for any subsequent breach of rule 14-3 will continue to be disqualification.

Note: The additional change is if an artificial device is multi functional such as a smart phone or PDA it can be used as long as it is used for measuring distance ONLY. If the other functions are used then the penalty procedure is in effect.

Rule 14-1b (Prohibition on Anchoring the Club While Making a Stroke) New

This new rule was announced in May of 2013 to become effective in 2016 to give enough time for all to make the change in a reasonable amount of time. The rule simply prohibits anchoring the club either "directly" or by use of an "anchor point" in making a stroke. The penalty is loss of hole in match play or two strokes in stroke play.

Hopefully this is a good start regarding the rule changes for 2016. There are many more minor changes along with new and revised decisions. By the time this is published the 2016 Rules of Golf should be on the USGA web site. As the year progresses, I will try and provide information on the rules that relate to our courses. If you see me around and have questions let's chat.

When you play in our club events, we post the scores for you so you do not have to worry about this issue. When you play in the Tuesday Sweeps, that are run by the Pro Shop, ALL of those events are NOT considered "T" scores. If you play in the Tuesday Sweeps and you post it as a "T" score it will be considered an incorrect posting and it will be treated the same as posting a wrong score or posting no score and will disqualify you from winning any "money" (credit from the Pro Shop) that you would have won for having a low score in your flight for that Tuesday play. Those that play in the CVS (Central Valley Seniors) events, those also are NOT "T" scores.
