

RULES CHAIRMAN

Rules 20 and 22

One of the most common procedures that we all do in our everyday round of golf is, when asked, span our ball marker on the putting surface to either side so the marker is not on the line of putt of your partner or fellow competitor. What are the consequences if the marker is not replaced and the ball is now putted from the wrong place? Under Rule 20-7 Playing From A Wrong Place the score with the ball played from the wrong place counts and the player must add two penalty strokes to that score. The player incurs no penalty for having putted from the right place after holing out from the wrong place because the hole has already been completed. If a player putts from the wrong place and does not hole out then realizes that he played from the wrong place picks up the ball and now plays from the right spot and holes out, the player incurs a total of four strokes—two for playing from the wrong place and two additional strokes for lifting the ball in play. If asked to move your marker try to remember that you did move it with some small reminders such as crossing your fingers, crossing your legs, laying your putter down on the green or removing your hat. Hopefully someone in your group will remind you to move your marker back before putting and getting yourself in a big mess.

Under Rule 22 Ball Assisting or Interfering with Play I want to remind you that if your ball is off the putting green and you are asked to mark and lift your ball because of assistance or interfering you cannot clean your ball. If the ball is cleaned it is a two stroke penalty. The best way to keep from cleaning your ball is to hold the ball between your thumb and forefinger or place it on the ground. It is a common reaction that when you have your ball in your hand you automatically want to clean it.

Handicap Controls #2 Peer Review

This is the second of ten controls that the USGA/NCGA have identified that all golfers should be aware of when playing by the USGA rules.

Basically "Peer Review" is the ability of golfers to gain an understanding of another player's potential ability and to form a reasonable basis for supporting or disputing a score that has been posted.

There are two essential elements of peer review:

- 1. Members of a golf club must have a reasonable and regular opportunity to play together.
- 2. Access must be provided to scoring records, as well as to a Handicap Index list for inspection by others, including, but not limited to, fellow club members. Note that in Lincoln Hills, you can look up any player's name using the terminal that you use for posting your scores in the Pro Shop.

Basically, all of us have the responsibility to question a person's Handicap after playing with them. You also have a responsibility to question or "help" a golfer you play with understand the rules of golf, especially our local rules.
