Course Handicap Tables - These two reports will allow you to lookup your course handicap based upon your handicap index for all tees on the course.

Handicap Index - This report will list your current & previous handicap index at the beginning of each month. It also shows your GHIN number for reference when entering a tournament.

Note - this report will not be created for the index revision on the 15th of the month.

Handicap History - This report shows your handicap history for the past 6 months.

Handicap Range - This report shows your Starting & Ending handicap index for the past 12 months.

Most Improved Golfer - This report shows the Top 100 Most Improved Golfers for the past 6 months.

Rounds Posted - This report shows the number of rounds you posted during the current calendar year.

RULES CHAIRMAN

This month I would like to provide you another rules situation. Hopefully you take the time to come up with the answers before going directly to the last page.

Situation—On a short par 4 Bruce's ball is on the fairway after a decent drive. He cannot play because the group ahead is still on the putting green. Therefore he stands away from the ball and makes a few practice swings. Unfortunately, he hits the ground and takes a divot, which happens to hit his ball which causes it to move a few inches. He leaves it where it comes to rest and once the putting green is cleared he plays a shot over a water hazard (yellow). His shot does not carry the hazard and plugs in the far bank within the hazard. He asks his fellow competitors what are his options and is told that he may play the ball as it lies, replay the stroke from where it was last played from under penalty of one stroke or drop a ball anywhere on the line from the flagstick through where the ball last crossed the margin of the hazard on the fairway side of the hazard under penalty of one stroke.He chooses to play the ball from within the hazard and just gets it out of the hazard. He grounds his club and plays his next shot with his back foot still in the hazard. The shot is good and he one puts. What is Bruce's score for the hole?

HANDICAP

I recently did some research on handicaps....here are some fun facts.....

1. ... If you are over the age of 70, your scoring average is 93.9

2. ...If you are over the age of 70, you average 34.8 putts a round...that is better than any age group...wow!!! We do get better with age.

3....According to Pete Dye, if you want to improve your handicap, play from the right tee boxes. (ps don't let your ego get in your way.) The rule of thumb is take your 5 iron distance x 36 and play from that yardage for 18 holes. So...if you hit your 5 iron 150 yards x 36 = 5400 yards ...play from those tees. You will enjoy your round more and hopefully score better 4....The average handicaps of all NCGA Golfers is 15.3...that is out of 1/4 of all Golfers that actually have a handicap. The other 40 million don't carry handicaps regularly 5. ... The rule of thumb according to Pete Dye, is if you are not consistently breaking 90, move up your tee boxes until you do. Pete says the average golfer hits a drive 180 to 210 yards and most of the time is trying to hit their second shot 170. Pete says, since the average golfer only hits the fairway 40% of the time and the next shot is 170, they only have less than 20% chance of hitting the green. This now makes golf less enjoyable as our scores go up and our chance of improving our game diminishes. Remember...every time you move back a tee box, you swing harder and your accuracy goes south. As your new handicap chairman, my goal is to give you some food for thought on achieving a handicap that you are happy with, keeps you playing often, enjoying the rounds you play and scoring well.

Quiz Answers

1- Drive to the fairway

2&3 - Two penalty strokes, one for causing his ball in play to move with the divot made from the practice swing (Rule 18-2a(i) and one more when he failed to replace his ball (Penalty statement under Rule 18).

4 - The shot which plug in the far bank of the hazard.

Note: There is no penalty for asking anyone what are the relief options for a water hazard. (Definition of Advice)

5 - Playing the ball from within the hazard

6 - Shot onto the putting green

Note: There is no penalty for taking your stance in a water hazard and grounding your club when the ball lies outside of the hazard

7 - One putt Bruce scores a 7 for the hole.
