RULES CHAIRMAN

This month I want to encourage everyone to think about signing up to play in our Presidents Cup Match Play tournament in May. Match Play was the first and only format during the early days of golf. Stroke Play followed at a later date and that is why in the Rules of Golf Book Match Play Rule 2 is listed first.

It is a unique format in that one player(s) plays against another player(s) over a stipulated round (18 holes) unless otherwise decreed by the Committee. Scoring is hole by hole and the player that has won more holes than there is to play is the winner. A hole is halved if each player holes out with the same number of strokes. If there is a tie the match continues until there is a winner.

This format allows the player to concede a stroke, a hole and the match. All concessions are final and cannot be declined or withdrawn. When making a concession it must be clearly communicated either verbally or by an action that shows the player's intent to concede.

Our Match Play is a net format and the players will be paired with like handicaps. The player with the higher handicap will play with the difference of the two handicaps where they fall on the card. The scorecard itself has no status, as the result of the match must be reported to the committee indicating how many holes up, such as three holes up with two to play (3 and 2). If the match were tied at the end of the stipulated round and won on the third extra hole, the result would be recorded as the 21st hole. Match Play does not require an aggregate score, however scores must still be posted. If a stroke were conceded you must record for handicap purposes the score you most likely would have had on the hole that the concession was given. If the match ends early the holes not played are recorded as par plus.

Please consider entering our Presidents Cup Match Play Championship and if you have never played match play now is the time.

Remember "It is what you think you know is what you don't know"
