

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

WOW! So much is happening right now it is hard to decide which is the most important. The fact is Lincoln Hills Golf Course has been very responsive to the concerns our members have had regarding a number of issues. The following are just a few of the things they have completed, are working on or will be working in order to make our golfing experience at LHGC a satisfying one:

- 1. Tee renovations. As you will have noticed, there are a number of tees being re-sodded (or rested) on both courses. Please be patient. Re-sodding takes time and just because the sod is down does not mean it is playable. We all look forward to the final result.
- 2. Bathroom combination locks. Due to outside use of the bathrooms, sanitation became a real problem. Toilet paper was being stolen. Golfers had to wait while non-golfers "camped" in the bathrooms, which slowed play. For all of these reasons Billy Casper Golf installed combination locks on the bathroom. The code will last for a couple of months, so write it down on your scorecard. By the way, in response to complaints from our members, the Men's Club and Women's Clubs requested this two years ago.

- 3. Sand Bunkers. The course maintenance crew needs to focus on the tee renovation as well as the critical issue of mowing. Therefore, the sand bunkers are going to be neglected for a while. See below for our Men's Club Board's action on several issues.
- 4. A new sand/divot dispenser has been installed on #13 Orchard.
- 5. The sweeps and our Men's Club Tounaments are now using the new NCGA recording system, so you do not have to post your scores. This applies to Tuesday Sweeps and club tournaments only.
- 6. Any day now an air compressor system will be added near the Pro Shop in order to clean your shoes.
- 7. Thanks to the rain and sunshine, the driving range turf is rebounding from winter and we are able to hit from grass rather than mats.
- 8. Course Superintendent Jason Wolf used a new aeration technique and our greens were punched, sanded and forced watered in one day and playable the next day. You could hardly notice after a week. Should prove beneficial through the hot summer months. (Editorial note: CVS played Sierra View Country Club two weeks after they punched and sanded their greens they were terrible..)

While the course has been proactive in dealing with a number of situations, so has your Men's Club Board of Directors. Here's what is going on ...

- 1. In light of the fact the sand bunkers are being ignored for a time, we are instituting a temporary Local Rule for balls landing in sand bunkers. All sand bunkers are to be treated as GUR (Ground Under Repair) which means you lift your ball out of the trap, find the nearest point of relief and drop the ball to put it in play. Please refer to the rule details on our website (www.lhmgc.org)
- 2. Sadly, the Board has found it necessary to add "disqualification" to our local rules relative to music and service animals. We had hoped "courtesy" would have been sufficient, but it didn't work. Therefore, if anyone breaches a "Condition of Competition" (which are part of our local rules) they will be disqualified from the tournament. If this is a team event, the team will be disqualified, as well. Again, please review our local rules (which includes Conditions of Competition) on our website for a complete explanation of these conditions.
- 3. The Board continues to pursue a name change for the purpose of obtaining IRS and California Franchise Tax Board non-profit status. We will alert you to the name change as soon as the Association approves the "new club."
- 4. Currently, there is a subcommittee working on creating a Sponsor Strategy that will enhance our tournaments as well as provide financial stability into the future. This new strategy will be unfolding and you will be the recipients of these changes through tournament amenities.

That's it for now. Keep your head down.

RULES CHAIRMAN

Just recently the golf committee notified you that because of the conditions of the bunkers on both courses a temporary local rule (Decision 25/13) was being put into effect for our tournaments and events. This local rule provides complete relief from the bunker by declaring the bunkers on both courses Ground Under Repair (GUR) until they can be renovated.

It is important that all understand the proper relief procedure when dropping out of the bunker. The nearest point of relief not nearer the hole is determined by where the ball lies in the bunker. Once the nearest point is determined the ball is dropped with in one club length. Remember there is only one nearest point and not the nearest point that best suits your needs, as there is only one nearest point. Also the nearest point is not where the ball entered the bunker. That reference point can only be used if the ball is lost in the bunker (GUR).

I suggest that the groups that play throughout the week adopt this temporary local rule. Some of you now lift the ball, rake the sand and then place. This procedure is a breach of Rule 13 Ball Played As It Lies resulting in a two-stroke penalty.

Remember "It is what you think you know is what you don't know"
