RULES CHAIRMAN

This month I want to focus on etiquette and remind everyone the importance of our behavior on the course. All players should conduct themselves in a disciplined manner, demonstrating courtesy and sportsmanship at all times. This is the spirit of the game of golf. Overall we do a pretty nice job with our behavior and courtesies on the course. However there are some areas that could be improved.

For the sake of safety it is important not to hit into the green until all players have had a chance to get into their carts and started towards their next hole. Our skill level is such that at times we could pull or push a shot right into the group that hasn't had the chance to move on. To help this situation out the group leaving the green should move quickly to their carts and move on. Don't sit in the cart and do the scoring, do that at the next tee.

In consideration for other players, players should not disturb their play by moving, talking or making unnecessary noise especially on the teeing ground. Players should not stand close to or directly behind the ball or directly behind the hole, when a player is about to play.

On the putting green, players should not stand or walk on another player's line of putt. Always know where the other players marks are located and if your next putt needs to be marked make sure you do not walk on your fellow competitor's line of putt. Also players should remain on or close to the putting green until all other players in the group have holed out.

We complain about the condition of the course yet we ignore the directional cart signs that have been placed to keep cart traffic away from the greens or worn, dry or wet areas that need to be rested. It is important to be courteous to the maintenance staff and stay out of the marked off areas with your carts. Those with handicap privileges still need to protect the areas around the greens by not driving to close.

As I already stated we do a pretty good job already. However the above suggestions should help with the courtesies need on the golf course.

Remember "It is what you think you know is what you don't know."

HANDICAP REPORT

Hello again,

Recently we had a few questions about letting you choose to play from white or green tees as an option in our events. Yes...you can choose to play from the green tees if you wish. However, your handicap will be reduced under the USGA 3.5 rule.

That is not a hard number handicap reduction as some people think. Under the 3.5 rule, and depending on the course, you may loose 3 strokes off you handicap, when you think it should be only 2 strokes.

My suggestion is that you read the 3.5 rule, it is lengthy, too lengthy to put in this newsletter, and get versed on it if you want to play from tees other than the whites going forward in our events.

Part of the reasoning behind the moving up tee Boxes, and using the 3.5 rule is speed of play, and making golf more enjoyable for all age groups and playing levels.

Hope this helps clarify why the tournament tee box sign ups have changed this yr, and how your handicap will be calculated, based on the course, and t box you select. The age / handicap rule still applies to playing from the red tees.


