PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Turn down the heat. Turn up the air conditioner. **Wow!** What a stretch of warm weather we have been having. I hear a lot of complaints, but in January, we will be begging for this heat :>)

A cautionary word is to PREPARE FOR THIS HEAT. Make sure you take <u>plenty of water</u> with you and drink some of that water <u>every hole</u>. By the way, coffee, tea or alcoholic drinks should not be a substitute for water. You might consider some of the <u>electrolyte/potassium</u> replacements or, at least, some sort of sports drink (Check out Hammer Nutrition and/or REI); lots of good products that are very helpful. PLEASE be protective of one another as it relates to HEAT EXHAUSTION and/or HEAT STROKE. Here is a brief tutorial:

HEAT EXHAUSTION – Caused by extreme heat and over exertion and exacerbated by poor hydration and lack of salt.

Symptoms: Confusion, dizziness, dark-colored urine, fainting or fatigue, headache, pale skin, profuse sweating (the opposite of Heat Stroke), and rapid heartbeat.

HEAT STROKE – Same causes as Heat Exhaustion except they are magnified.

Symptoms: Absence of sweating, rapid pulse, breathing difficulty, confusion/agitation, nausea and vomiting

In either case <u>hydration and rest is critical</u> – don't try to "push through." Know when to stop. Should you suspect your playing partners (or you) might be having Heat Stroke, do the following:

- 1. Ask the person to smile. A crooked smile is a stroke indicator.
- 2. Ask the person to complete a sentence ... that makes sense.
- 3. Ask the person to raise both arms simultaneously (If someone is having or has had a stroke, this will be very difficult for them to do.
- 4. Ask the person to stick out their tongue. A crooked tongue is another stroke indicator.

Let's all be prudent as we slash that ball around the course.

RULES CHAIRMAN

This month I used a question from the Metropolitan Golf Association Annual Rules Quiz. They are known to keep you on your toes and make you think. This particular question should keep you focused awhile. Try to logically figure it out before you look at the answer on the last page of this newsletter. Have fun!

In a stroke play event, Player A's approach shot comes to rest on the putting green leaving him with a long 75-foot putt. Player B's approach shot lands in a greenside bunker. A marks and lifts his ball, then reads his line of putt. B's bunker shot comes to rest on the putting green, but he still has a 30-foot putt remaining. A reads his line of putt from the other side of the hole while B is cleaning up the bunker. Just as B finishes, A replaces his ball. A putts his ball and comes to rest, but is overhanging the hole. B, not paying attention, immediately walks up to his ball and putts it. B's ball not only strikes A's ball, deflecting it into the hole, but B's ball follows it in as well. Unsure of how to proceed, the competitors agree that since both balls are holed, there is no issue and they proceed to tee off on the

next hole and complete the stipulated round. They inform the Committee of this situation prior to signing and returning their scorecards. The Committee should rule:

- A) Both players' balls are considered holed and there is no penalty.
- B) Player A's ball is considered holed. Player B's ball is considered holed and he is assessed a two –stroke penalty.
- C) Player A is disqualified and Player B' ball is considered holed and he is assessed a two-stroke penalty.
- D) Both players should have replaced their balls and replayed their last strokes. As both players failed to hole out, they are both disqualified.

Answer to the rules quiz question is C

Rule 18-5 If a ball in play and at rest is moved by another ball in motion after a stroke, the moved ball must be replaced. This refers to A's ball as it needed to be replaced on the edge of the hole and putted out. Since A thought that his ball was holed and teed off on the next hole without replacing his ball on the edge of the hole and holing out, player A is disqualified – Rule 3-2.

Rule 19-5a Since both balls were on the green, prior to B's stroke, B incurs a two stroke penalty for hitting A's ball at rest on the putting green.
