


Men's Golf Club of Lincoln Hills (MGCLH)





Players and caddies are permitted to touch the putting green, on or off the line of play, to point out an aiming spot. Back in 2019, when players became allowed to repair certain damage on the green, they were also no longer prohibited from touching their line of play.

What players can't do is set down an object anywhere on the course to show a line of play per rule 10.2b(1). And remember, the player cannot avoid the penalty by removing the object prior to the stroke is made.
