

What is Member Planet?

Every once in a while, I get an email or phone call asking me about MemberPlanet. "What is it?" "Why are they contacting me?" "What

does it do?". Etc. When you pay your annual golf club dues, you become a member of the Men's Golf Club of Lincoln Hills (MGCLH) and the Northern California Golf Association (NCGA). Each Organization provides you with unique membership benefits designed to enhance your golfing experience. Future articles will detail those benefits, so you can get a good understanding of what each Organization does for you. But, did you know that there is an entity that connects these two organizations together? This entity maintains Active and Lapsed Membership rosters, Member Club transfers, general and group Email distribution lists, online dues' collections, Membership Directory, and Membership Profile depository. This entity is called MemberPlanet.

MemberPlanet is a third party "membership management" software tool that is provided to us and supported by NCGA. All NCGA Clubs have access to the MemberPlanet tool. Did you know that we have over 320 members in the MGCLH? Did you also know that there is an annual member turn-over rate of 10-15%? That's a lot of changes to keep track of. As the MGCLH membership roster is ever changing,

I think it is important for all our members to read the local rules and abide by them.

The handicap system is the best way to let people with different abilities compete fairly in daily and tournament play. If you are not posting ALL your scores, good and bad, then your handicap is not a true indication of your ability. It is VERY simple to post scores, it takes less than 30 seconds to do this after each round. If we all followed the rules, posted ALL our scores, our competitions would be fair for everyone. In the Local Rules there is a system in place to deal with individuals that don't follow the posting guidelines. I encourage everyone to do the best job they can posting their scores.

Have fun, be honest and allow everyone the chance to compete equally.

Also, a friendly reminder to keep golf carts at least 30 yards from the greens. Let's do our part to protect our golf course and keep it in good shape.

HOW IT WORKS:

The Lincoln Hills Golf Club Pro Shop hosts a weekly "Sweeps" on Tuesday mornings.

A \$3.00 contribution to the prize pool, a GHIN number, and your greens fees are all that is needed to participate.

The sweeps are stroke play with flights based on handicaps.

You can sign up as a single and meet new golfers each time.

You can also sign up as twosomes, threesomes, and foursomes.

There is 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th prize money per flight for Low Gross, Low Net, Closest to the Pin (CTTP), and Long Drive.

Your prize money is deposited in your credit account at the Pro Shop.

You can view your credit balance of winnings in the CHRONOGOLF app.

To sign up for the sweeps, send an email to (Sherrill Slotsve) sherrills31@gmail.com. Provide your GHIN number and the Tees you play from.

She will then include you on her weekly emails to sign up for the following week's sweeps.
