



2024 Hall of Fame East Bay Football Officials Association Inductee

LH GOLF COURSE GENERAL MANAGER

Well as much as we don't want to say it, winter is here. The weather is starting to turn and the rainy season is among us. I hope that doesn't stop some of you from still coming out and enjoying the course because as many of you know, the courses drain well and the conditions throughout winter are still very playable. And just because winter is here, that is



not stopping us from making improvements to Lincoln Hills. You may notice that we have begun some concrete work on holes where there are hazardous conditions and broken concrete. Those areas are getting fixed as well as we are very excited about the replacement of all of the drinking fountains throughout the property. All of the restrooms as well as the location at the clubhouse will have new drinking fountains with bottle fillers attached to them to fill up your water bottles. They are all filtered and refrigerated water so in the hot summer months, we don't have to rely on anyone making sure the water jugs are filled up with ice and water. There will be cold filtered water throughout both courses at all times. You will also start seeing some work being done on the back of the driving range as I've hinted to before for the new teaching building in anticipation of the Lincoln Hills Golf Academy. The process will take a few months and we anticipate the grand opening of the Academy on February 1st depending on how well the weather cooperates over the next few months. More details to come on that.

The 2025 memberships will be coming out on December 1st with the new programs and details to start with signups and renewals. Make sure to check out the website as well as the new bulletin boards outside the golf shop to find more details starting December 1st

RULES DIRECTOR

Did you know.....

There is some confusion on what you are able to repair on the putting green. The rules allow a player to repair damage to the green.

"Damage on the putting green" means any damage caused by any person (including the player) or outside influence, such as:

- Ball marks, shoe damage (such as spike marks) and scrapes or indentations caused by equipment or a flagstick,
- Old hole plugs, turf plugs, seams of cut turf and scrapes or indentations from maintenance tools or vehicles,
- · Animal tracks or hoof indentations,
- · Embedded objects (such as a stone, acorn, hail or tee) and indentations caused by them.

But "damage on the putting green" does not include any damage or conditions that result from:

- Normal practices for maintaining the overall condition of the putting green (such as aeration holes and grooves from vertical mowing),
- · Irrigation or rain or other natural forces,
- · Natural surface imperfections (such as weeds or areas of bare, diseased or uneven growth), or
- · Natural wear of the hole.

They then select the best ball after their second shots, and then play alternate shot until the ball is holed. The player whose second ball was not chosen plays the third shot. This all adds up to a fun time, so mark your calendars.



HOW IT WORKS:

The sweeps are stroke play with flights based on handicaps.

You can sign up as a single and meet new golfers each time.

You can also sign up as twosomes, threesomes, and foursomes.

There is 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th prize money per flight for Low Gross, Low Net, Closest to the Pin (CTTP), and Long Drive.

Your prize money is deposited in your credit account at the Pro Shop.

You can view your credit balance of winnings in the CHRONOGOLF app.

To sign up for the sweeps, send an email to (Sherrill Slotsve) sherrills31@gmail.com. Provide your GHIN number and the Tees you play from.

She will then include you on her weekly emails to sign up for the following week's sweeps.

There are no "Sweeps" on the Tuesdays when the Men's Golf Club is holding a tournament.
