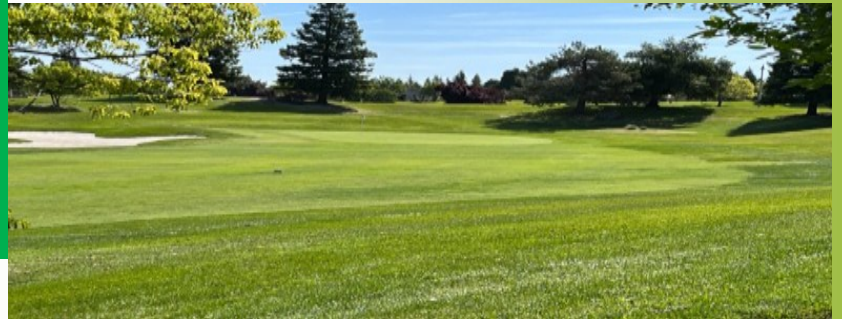

LH GOLF COURSE GENERAL MANAGER

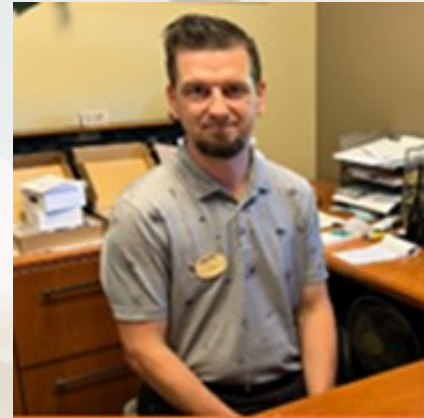

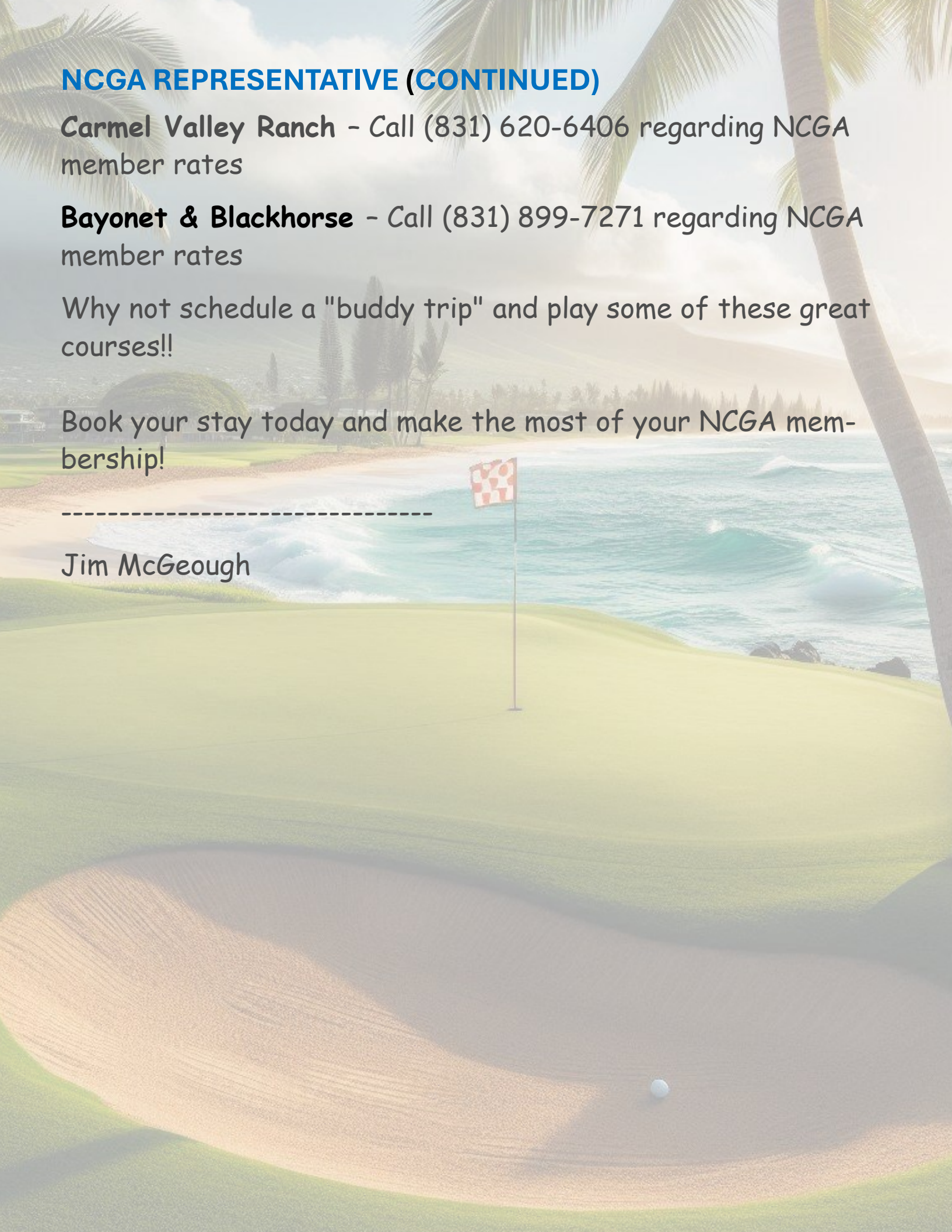

Good to know....

RULES DIRECTOR

The Men's Club Local Rules and tournament rules sheets are created for fair play during our tournaments. Daily play can use the Local Rules for guidance, but isn't required. Many groups play

"recreationally" and "bend" the rules a bit (ie: gimmies, etc.). As a reminder, our tournaments follow USGA Rules, Clarifications and handicaps. This allows everyone to compete fairly against the field. So it is incumbent that everyone follow the rules and administer penalties when required. A good way to handle this and not create enemies is to point out a possible rules violation in this manner; "I saw that you moved your ball beyond the scorecard length. I think that placed you in a wrong place and is a penalty. How would you like to handle that? If they resist just say "let's ask in scoring"? Better yet you can give me a call at (916) 390-3429. I'll answer as soon as I am able. If I don't respond you should play 2 balls under rule 20.1c and report this to scoring.

Speaking of scoring. We are still getting cards turned in that are not legible or are not signed properly. You should check that everything is correct before leaving scoring. If you don't your team will be disqualified.

Thank you in advance. Let's make these tournaments fun, but fair.

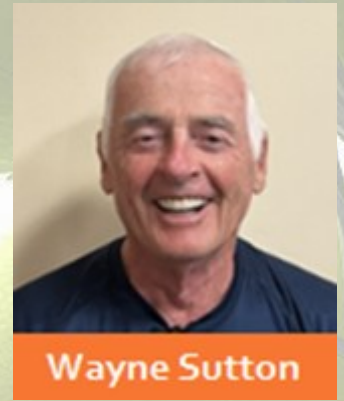

HOW IT WORKS:

The Lincoln Hills Golf Club Pro Shop hosts a weekly “Sweeps” on Tuesday mornings.

A \$3.00 contribution to the prize pool, a GHIN number, and your greens fees are all that is needed to participate.

The sweeps are stroke play with flights based on handicaps.

You can sign up as a single and meet new golfers each time.

You can also sign up as twosomes, threesomes, and foursomes.

There is 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th prize money per flight for Low Gross, Low Net, Closest to the Pin (CTTP), and Long Drive.

Your prize money is deposited in your credit account at the Pro Shop.

You can view your credit balance of winnings in the CHRONOGOLF app.

To sign up for the sweeps, send an email to (Sherrill Slotsve) sherrills31@gmail.com. Provide your GHIN number and the Tees you play from.

She will then include you on her weekly emails to sign up for the following week's sweeps.
